Join the Voluntary Retirement Plan?

Although employees agree that contributing to a retirement plan is a good financial decision, a large number still do not participate in either of Madison County's 457(b) plans. Madison County offers two voluntary retirement savings plans under section 457(b): Nationwide Retirement Solutions and RSA-1 through the State of Alabama. This lack of participation is often the result of a misunderstanding of the rules or a lack of awareness of the benefits.

Here are some of the advantages of making salary-deferral contributions to either of these plans.

1. It Reduces Your Taxable Income

Salary-deferral contributions to these plans are made on a tax-deferred basis. This means that your taxable income for the year is reduced by the amount you contribute to the plan. For example, let's say that your tax filing status is "single," your taxable income for the year is \$31,000. If you make a pre-tax salary-deferral contribution of \$2,000 to your 457(b) account your taxable income will be reduced to \$29,000, and the amount of taxes you owe will also be reduced.

Of course, an individual's tax reduction depends on the amount deferred and the tax bracket which their taxable income falls. Therefore, the tax savings are not the same for everyone. In the example above, you will eventually need to withdraw the \$2,000 you deferred. Your goal will be to withdraw it after you retire, when you are likely in a lower tax bracket, you will pay less tax on the \$2,000 than you would've paid had you not chosen to defer it to your retirement account.

2. It Provides Tax Deferred Growth and Allows You to Defer Taxes

Another benefit of saving with a tax-deferred retirement plan is that the earnings on investments are also tax-deferred. This means that you will not pay taxes on your earnings, regardless of their value, until you make a withdrawal from the plan. Therefore, you have some control over when you pay taxes on those earnings, which in turn could affect how much tax you pay.

You can choose to make withdrawals in years when your income is lower, which may mean, you are in a lower tax bracket. Usually, an employee is allowed to make withdrawals from a qualified plan only after meeting certain requirements, as defined under the plan. In addition, required minimum distribution rules will apply, which will dictate withdrawal options.

Conclusion

There are many benefits to making salary-deferral contributions into either of the Madison County 457(b) sponsored plans. Reducing taxable income and allowing the earnings to grow tax-free until withdrawal are some of the best reasons to participate.

The goal in a savings plan is to save. Our 457(b) plans allow employees to save until they retire or terminate. Following retirement there are many ways to access the balance; monthly payment, partial payment at any time, or remain invested until age 70 ½. When retired and over age 70 ½ the participant must take required minimum distributions on an annual basis. Any funds must be reported as "income" for the year the funds were received. The 457(b) vendors (RSA-1 and Nationwide) will distribute the tax document 1099R to use in the personal tax filings.

Be sure to join or increase your deferrals into the 457(b) plans for 2018.

Following a cost-of-living-increase each deferral must be increased or the employee will be saving less.

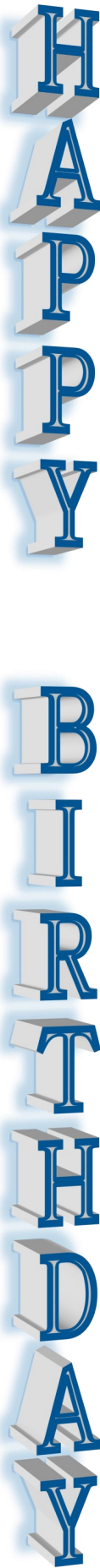
